







Percent distribution of women and men age 15-49 by background characteristics

Key Messages

- Sindh MICS 2018-19 has a sample size of 20,540 households with a 99% response rate. The response rate for woman age 15-49 and children under 5 were 97% and 98% respectively. The response rate for men 15-49 was slightly lower at 92%
- 90% of households are headed by a man

- 46% of household heads have no education
- 52% of households have children under five years of age. There are many children in Sindh province who need early childhood development (ECD), and many parents who need awareness and knowledge about ECD.
- Among all children age 0-17, almost

9% (one in eleven), is living with either one parent or no parent. Some of these children may need social protection assistance

Karachi is the most populated division in Sindh province. More than 38% of households in Sindh province are situated in Karachi Division

The Sindh Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey (MICS) was carried out in 2018-19 by the Sindh Bureau of Statistics, Planning and Development Department as part of the global MICS programme. Technical support was provided by the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF). UNICEF and Government of Sindh provided financial support. The objective of this snapshot is to disseminate selected findings from the Sindh MICS 2018-19 related to Survey and Sample Characteristics.
