WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

- SPI-Sindh increased by 0.38% WoW and increased by 1.11% MoM.
- Cereals & Bakery recorded the highest category increase (+1.59%), while Fruits registered the largest decline (-2.67%).
- Onions (+6.8%) and Hi-Speed Diesel (HSD) (+2.5%) recorded the largest increases, while Tomatoes registered the largest decline (-7.0%), followed by Potatoes (-5.9%).
- SPI-Sindh calculated by SBOS using PBS price data for four major cities, in contrast, decreased marginally by 0.01%.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

SENSITIVE PRICE INDEX SINDH (SPI-Sindh) FOR THE WEEK ENDED ON 27.08.2026

Sensitive Price Index of Sindh (SPI-Sindh) has been calculated on a weekly basis to observe the price changes of 50 essential items in Sindh. SPI-Sindh is based on 50 essential items and prices collected from 120 shops, 60 markets in 30 districts of Sindh (4 shops and 2 markets per district). The prices of Electricity & Gas are obtained from PBS's SPI report for the same period. The week-on-week (WoW) and month-on-month (MoM) changes in SPI-Sindh are as follows:

As a validation strategy, SPI-Sindh was cross-checked against the PBS price data for four major cities of Sindh—Karachi, Hyderabad, Sukkur and Larkana disseminated under the National SPI for the week ended on 27.08.2026. The direction of movement diverged this week: SPI-Sindh increased by 0.38 percent while the PBS-based comparator decreased marginally by 0.01 percent (see note below). The SPI calculated by SBOS using the PBS price data for these four cities is presented below for comparison.

ANALYSIS OF SPI-SINDH:

SPI-Sindh for the current week ended on 27.08.2026 increased by 0.38 percent compared with the previous week, while on a month-on-month (MoM) basis, the index recorded an increase of 1.11 percent. This indicates a marginal increase in the prices of essential commodities during the week and on a MoM basis.

During the current week, an increase was observed in 17 commodities. The highest increase was recorded in Onions (+6.8%), followed by Hi Speed Diesel (HSD) (+2.5%), LPG Cylinder, 11kg (+2.4%), Electricity Charges, Upto 50 Units (+2.1%), and Wheat Flour, Bag Average Quality (+1.9%). Other notable increases were observed in Petrol, Super (+1.8%), Long Cloth (+1.6%),

Garlic (+1.2%), and Rice Basmati Broken, Average Quality (+1.0%). Moderate increases were also recorded in Rice Irri (Punjab/Sindh) (+0.8%), Pulse Moong, Washed (+0.5%), and Firewood Whole (+0.5%). Marginal increases were also observed in Milk, Fresh, Unboiled (+0.4%), Curd (Dahi) (+0.3%), Red Chilli Powder, Loose (+0.3%), Mutton, Average Quality (+0.2%), and Tea, Lipton Yellow Label, Packet (+0.2%).

On the other hand, a decrease was recorded in 22 commodities. The largest decrease was observed in Tomatoes (-7.0%), followed by Potatoes (-5.9%), Chicken Farm, Broiler, Live (-3.0%), Bananas (-2.5%), Washing Soap, 200-250 gm (-1.9%), and Cooked Daal, Average Hotel (-1.8%). Other decreases were recorded in Georgette (-1.6%), Lawn (-1.4%), Tea Prepared, Average Hotel (-1.3%), Shirting (-1.2%), and Chappal Sponge Bata (Gents) (-1.2%). Marginal decreases were also recorded in Soap, Lifebuoy (-0.8%), Pulse Gram, Washed (-0.7%), Cooked Beef, Average Hotel (-0.7%), Sandal Bata (Ladies) (-0.7%), Mustard Oil, Average Quality (-0.6%), Gur, Average Quality (-0.5%), Beef With Bone, Average quality (-0.4%), Sandal Bata (Gents) (-0.3%), Cooking Oil, Tin (-0.2%), and Vegetable Ghee (Loose) and Vegetable Ghee, Tin (-0.2% and -0.1% respectively).

The prices of 11 commodities remained unchanged, including Bread Plain, Medium Size, Powdered Milk, Nido, Polybag, Eggs Hen, Farm, Pulse Masoor, Washed, Pulse Mash, Washed, Sugar, Refined, Salt Powder, Loose (Lahori), Cigarettes, K-2/Capstan, 20's, Gas Charges (Upto 3.3719 MMBTU), Energy Saver (14 watts), and Match Box (Regular).

The weekly trend reflects rising price pressure from fuel and cereal commodities, particularly Onions, Hi Speed Diesel (HSD), LPG Cylinder, 11kg, and Electricity Charges. These increases outweighed decreases in Tomatoes, Potatoes, Chicken Farm, Broiler, Live, and Bananas, and selected clothing and prepared food items. Similarly, the marginal MoM increase of 1.11 percent indicates that the overall price level remained broadly higher, above that recorded during the corresponding week of the previous month.

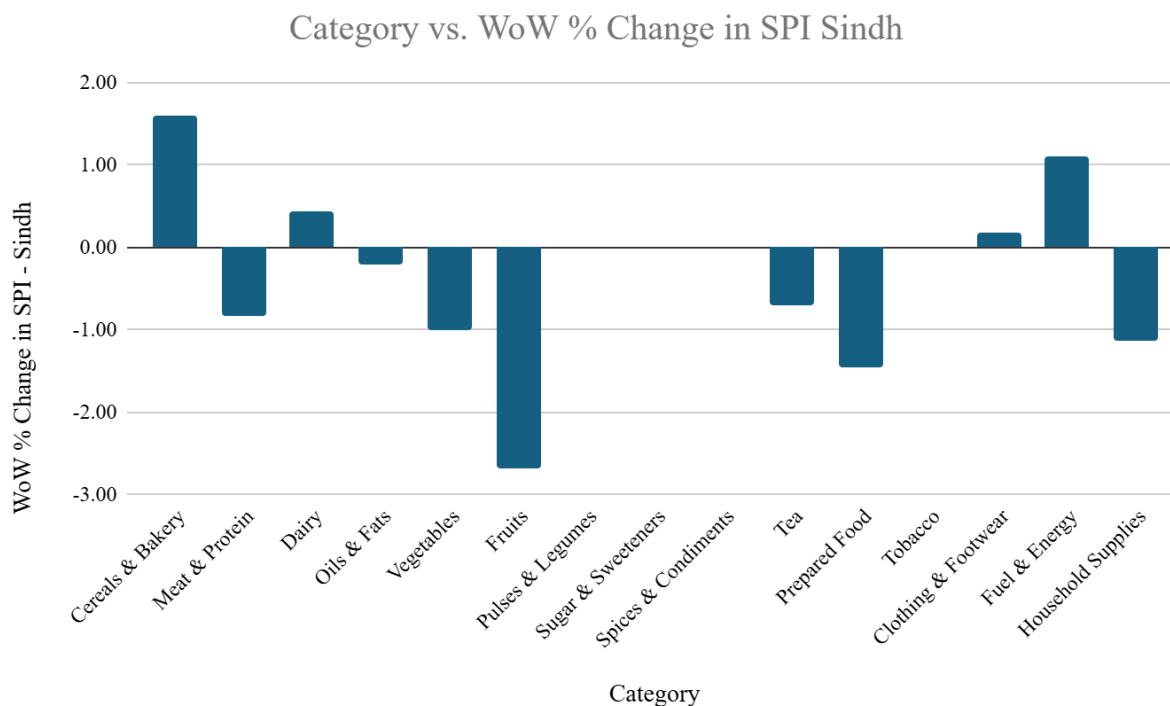
PART-II (SPI REPORT)

CATEGORY-WISE WEEKLY PRICE MOVEMENT IN SPI-SINDH (27.08.2026 OVER 20.08.2026)

The category-wise analysis of SPI-Sindh for the week ended 27.08.2026 indicates an overall increase of 0.38 percent over the previous week. The increase was led by Cereals & Bakery (1.59%), followed by Fuel & Energy (1.10%), Dairy (0.43%), and Clothing & Footwear (0.18%). Decreases were recorded in Fruits (-2.67%), Prepared Food (-1.46%), Household Supplies (-1.14%), Vegetables (-1.00%), Meat & Protein (-0.82%), Tea (-0.69%), and Oils & Fats (-0.20%). Pulses & Legumes, Sugar & Sweeteners, Spices & Condiments, and Tobacco remained unchanged (0.00%) during the week. The detailed list of commodities included under each category is provided at Annex-A.

CATEGORY-WISE DIVISION LEVEL ANALYSIS (WoW)

The division-wise analysis indicates mixed regional price movements across categories during the week. At the provincial (Sindh) level, the largest increase was recorded in Fuel & Energy (+1.6%), followed by Cereals & Bakery (+1.2%) and Dairy (+0.3%). Pulses & Legumes, Sugar & Sweeteners, Spices & Condiments, and Tobacco remained unchanged at 0.0%. The largest

provincial decline was observed in Fruits (-2.7%), followed by Prepared Food (-1.5%), Vegetables (-1.2%), Clothing & Footwear (-0.9%), Meat & Protein (-0.8%), Household Supplies (-0.7%), Tea (-0.6%), and Oils & Fats (-0.2%).

Karachi recorded the largest increase in Cereals & Bakery (+3.7%), followed by Fuel & Energy (+1.8%), Pulses & Legumes (+0.5%), Clothing & Footwear (+0.3%), and a marginal increase in Prepared Food (+0.1%). Tea remained unchanged (0.0%). The largest decline was observed in Vegetables (-2.5%), followed by Fruits (-2.4%), Household Supplies and Meat & Protein (-1.2% each), Sugar & Sweeteners and Spices & Condiments (-0.7% each), Tobacco (-0.4%), Oils & Fats (-0.3%), and Dairy (-0.1%).

Hyderabad registered the largest increase in Fuel & Energy (+1.5%), followed by Dairy (+0.7%), Cereals & Bakery (+0.6%), Meat & Protein (+0.4%), Fruits (+0.3%), Clothing & Footwear (+0.2%), and marginal increases in Spices & Condiments and Household Supplies (+0.1% each). Tea and Prepared Food remained unchanged (0.0%). The largest decline was observed in Pulses & Legumes (-1.2%), followed by Sugar & Sweeteners and Tobacco (-0.4% each), Vegetables (-0.2%), and Oils & Fats (-0.1%).

Sukkur recorded the largest increase in Fuel & Energy (+1.6%), followed by Dairy (+0.4%) and a marginal increase in Sugar & Sweeteners (+0.1%). Meat & Protein, Tobacco, and Household Supplies remained unchanged (0.0%). The sharpest decline was recorded in Fruits (-2.5%), followed by Pulses & Legumes (-2.0%), Cereals & Bakery and Vegetables (-1.9% each), Prepared Food (-1.8%), Spices & Condiments and Tea (-0.6% each), Clothing & Footwear (-0.5%), and Oils & Fats (-0.2%).

Larkana recorded the largest increase in Fuel & Energy (+1.8%), followed by Dairy (+0.5%), and marginal increases in Pulses & Legumes (+0.2%) and Cereals & Bakery (+0.1%). Tobacco remained unchanged (0.0%). Larkana recorded the sharpest declines in the province, led by Fruits (-18.1%), followed by Prepared Food (-4.5%), Clothing & Footwear (-4.1%), Vegetables (-3.6%), Household Supplies (-2.5%), Meat & Protein (-2.3%), Spices & Condiments (-2.1%), Tea (-0.7%), Oils & Fats (-0.6%), and Sugar & Sweeteners (-0.1%).

Mirpurkhas recorded an exceptional increase in Fruits (+27.3%) and a substantial increase in Vegetables (+7.4%), followed by Cereals & Bakery (+1.0%), Fuel & Energy (+0.6%), and a marginal

increase in Pulses & Legumes (+0.1%). Dairy, Sugar & Sweeteners, Spices & Condiments, Tea, Prepared Food, Tobacco, Clothing & Footwear, and Household Supplies remained unchanged (0.0%). The only declines were in Meat & Protein (-1.2%) and Oils & Fats (-0.8%).

Shaheed Benazirabad recorded the largest increase in Pulses & Legumes (+2.3%), followed by Spices & Condiments (+1.6%), Fuel & Energy (+1.4%), Cereals & Bakery (+0.8%), Sugar & Sweeteners and Tobacco (+0.6% each), Dairy (+0.3%), and a marginal increase in Clothing & Footwear (+0.1%). Household Supplies remained unchanged (0.0%). The largest decline was observed in Fruits (-6.9%), followed by Vegetables (-1.7%), Meat & Protein (-1.0%), Prepared Food (-0.9%), Tea (-0.8%), and Oils & Fats (-0.2%).

Overall, weekly price movements were characterized by a broad-based increase in Fuel & Energy across all six divisions, ranging from +0.6% in Mirpurkhas to +1.8% in Karachi and Larkana, alongside sharp, divergent movements in Fruits and Vegetables. Fruit prices fell steeply in Larkana (-18.1%) and Shaheed Benazirabad (-6.9%), and more moderately in Sukkur (-2.5%) and Karachi (-2.4%), while Hyderabad recorded a marginal increase (+0.3%); Mirpurkhas was the outlier, posting an exceptional increase of +27.3%. Vegetable prices followed a similar pattern, declining in Karachi, Hyderabad, Sukkur, and Larkana — led by Larkana's -3.6% — while rising sharply in Mirpurkhas (+7.4%). Cereals & Bakery rose in five of the six divisions, led by Karachi (+3.7%), but fell in Sukkur (-1.9%). Meat & Protein declined in most divisions, most notably Larkana (-2.3%), with only Hyderabad recording an increase (+0.4%).

Category-level values represent the **unweighted arithmetic average** of commodity-level changes within each respective category.

For each division, the representative price of every commodity is calculated as the geometric mean of its district-level prices. Base prices and commodity weights are then applied to obtain weighted price relatives for the current and previous weeks.

Commodity-level week-on-week percentage changes are calculated from the current- and previous-week weighted price relatives.

The Sindh column is calculated independently using the geometric mean of prices across all 30 districts for each commodity, followed by the same weighting, week-on-week change and category-aggregation procedure. It is not calculated from the six divisional values.

CATEGORY-WISE MONTHLY PRICE MOVEMENT IN SPI-SINDH (27.08.2026 OVER 30.07.2026)

The category-wise MoM analysis for the period ending 27.08.2026 indicates a marginal overall increase of 1.11 percent compared with 30.07.2026. The increase was led by Vegetables (6.83%), followed by Cereals & Bakery (2.41%), Meat & Protein (1.75%), Dairy (1.25%), Fuel & Energy (1.16%), and Oils & Fats (0.61%).

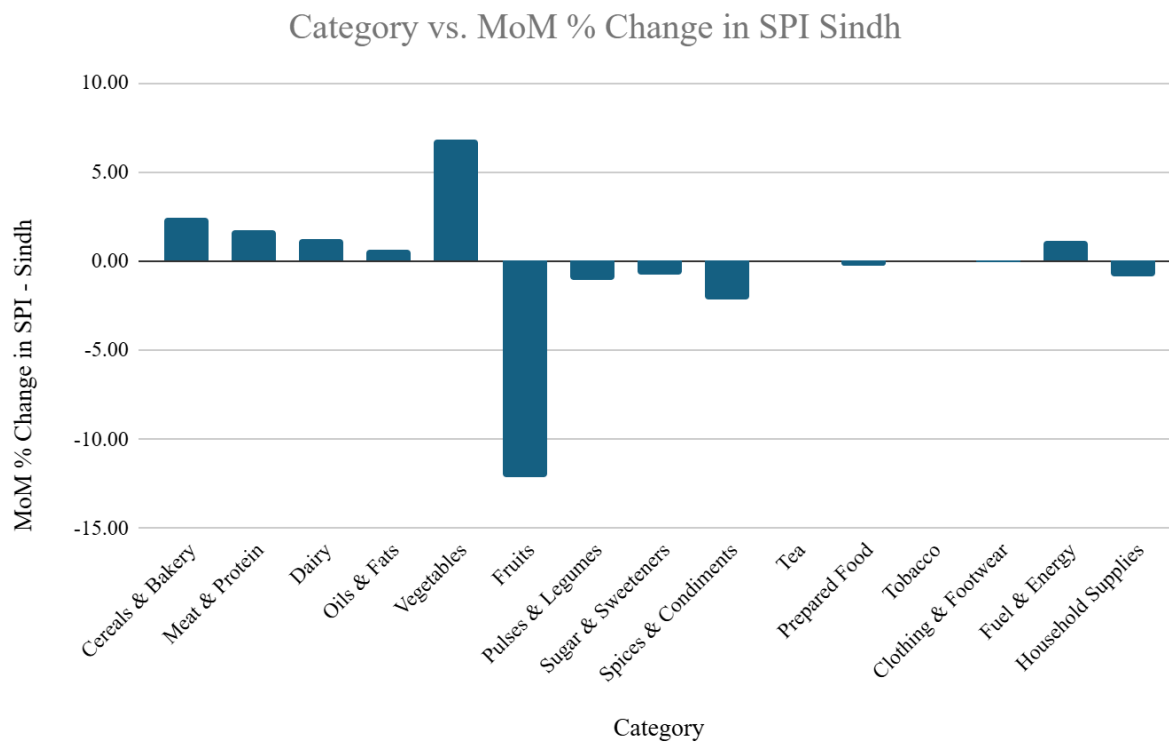
These increases were partly offset by decreases in Fruits (-12.08%), Spices & Condiments (-2.17%), Pulses & Legumes (-1.09%), Household Supplies (-0.86%), Sugar & Sweeteners (-0.77%), Prepared Food (-0.27%), and Clothing & Footwear (-0.09%).

Tea and Tobacco remained unchanged (0.00%) during the period. The detailed list of commodities included under each category is provided at Annex-A.

¹ Category changes in Table 1 are derived from the SPI-Sindh category indices using the prescribed item weights. The division-level figures in Table 3 represent averages of commodity-level percentage changes and are therefore not directly comparable with the category-index changes reported in Table 1.
