WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

- SPI-Sindh increased by 0.53% WoW and increased by 1.34% MoM.
- Vegetables recorded the highest category increase (+7.21%), while Fruits registered the largest decline (-1.65%).
- Onions (+18.4%) and Chicken Farm, Broiler Live (+3.7%) recorded the largest increases, while Bananas registered the largest decline (-1.7%), followed by Rice Basmati Broken, Average Quality (-1.5%).
- SPI-Sindh calculated by SBOS using PBS price data for four major cities, also increased marginally by 1.07%.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

SENSITIVE PRICE INDEX SINDH (SPI-Sindh) FOR THE WEEK ENDED ON 03.09.2026

Sensitive Price Index of Sindh (SPI-Sindh) has been calculated on a weekly basis to observe the price changes of 50 essential items in Sindh. SPI-Sindh is based on 50 essential items and prices collected from 120 shops, 60 markets in 30 districts of Sindh (4 shops and 2 markets per district). The prices of Electricity & Gas are obtained from PBS's SPI report for the same period. The week-on-week (WoW) and month-on-month (MoM) changes in SPI-Sindh are as follows:

As a validation strategy, SPI-Sindh was cross-checked against the PBS price data for four major cities of Sindh—Karachi, Hyderabad, Sukkur and Larkana disseminated under the National SPI for the week ended on 03.09.2026. During this week: SPI-Sindh increased by 0.53 percent also the PBS-based comparator increased by 1.07 percent. The SPI calculated by SBOS using the PBS price data for these four cities is presented below for comparison.

ANALYSIS OF SPI-SINDH:

SPI-Sindh for the current week ended on 03.09.2026 increased by 0.53 percent compared with the previous week, while on a month-on-month (MoM) basis, the index recorded an increase of 1.34 percent. This indicates an increase in the prices of essential commodities during the week and MoM basis.

During the current week, an increase was observed in 23 commodities. The highest increase was recorded in Onions (+18.4%), followed by Chicken Farm, Broiler, Live (+3.7%), Wheat Flour, Bag Average Quality (+2.7%), Lawn (+2.30%), and Potatoes (+2.1%). Other notable

increases were observed in Long Cloth (+2.0%), Washing Soap, 200-250 gm (+1.9%), Sandal Bata (Gents) (+1.8%), and Georgette (+1.6%). Moderate increases were also recorded in Tea Prepared, Average Hotel (+1.3%), Rice Irri (Punjab/Sindh) (+0.8%), and Soap, Lifebuoy (+0.8%). Marginal increases were also observed in Mutton, Average Quality (+0.7%), Mustard Oil, Average Quality (+0.6%), Petrol, Super (+0.6%), Cooking Oil, Tin (+0.5%), and Vegetable Ghee, Tin (+0.5%).

On the other hand, a decrease was recorded in 14 commodities. The largest decrease was observed in Bananas (-1.7%), followed by Rice Basmati Broken, Average Quality (-1.5%), Pulse Gram, Washed (-1.5%), Tomatoes (-1.4%), Shirting (-1.4%), and Pulse Moong, Washed (-1.1%). Other decreases were recorded in Milk, Fresh, Unboiled (-0.9%), Garlic (-0.9%), Cooked Daal, Average Hotel (-0.6%), Pulse Masoor, Washed (-0.4%), and Cigarettes, K-2/Capstan, 20's (-0.4%). Marginal decreases were also recorded in Firewood Whole (-0.4%), Beef With Bone, Average Quality (-0.2%) and Tea, Lipton Yellow Label, Packet (-0.2%).

The prices of 13 commodities remained unchanged, including Bread Plain, Medium Size, Curd (Dahi), Eggs Hen, Farm, Vegetable Ghee (Loose), Sugar, Refined, Gur, Average Quality, Salt Powder, Loose, Lahori, Red Chilli Powder, Loose, Electricity Charges, Upto 50 Units, Gas Charges, Upto 3.3719 MMBTU, Energy Saver (14 watts), Match Box, Regular, Hi Speed Diesel (HSD).

The weekly trend reflects rising price pressure from food and clothing commodities, particularly Onions, Chicken Farm, Broiler, Live, Wheat Flour, Bag Average Quality, and Lawn. These increases outweighed decreases in Bananas, Rice Basmati Broken, Average Quality, Pulse Gram, Washed, and Tomatoes, and selected clothing and prepared food items. Similarly, MoM increase of 1.34 percent indicates that the overall price level remained broadly higher, above that recorded during the corresponding week of the previous month.

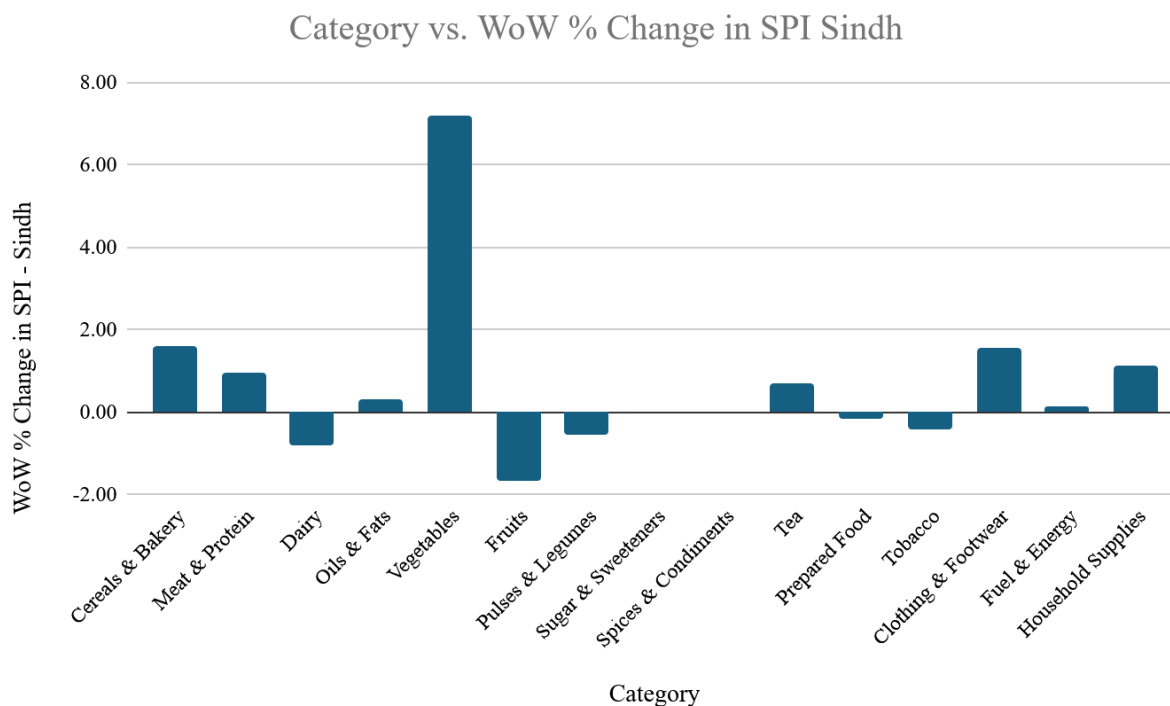
PART-II (SPI REPORT)

CATEGORY-WISE WEEKLY PRICE MOVEMENT IN SPI-SINDH (03.09.2026 OVER 27.08.2026)

The category-wise analysis of SPI-Sindh for the week ended 03.09.2026 indicates an overall increase of 0.53 percent over the previous week. The increase was led by Vegetables (7.21%), followed by Cereals & Bakery (1.62%), Clothing & Footwear (1.56%), Household Supplies (1.15%), Meat & Protein (0.98%), Tea (0.7%), Oils & Fats (0.3%) and Fuel & Energy (0.13%). Decreases were recorded in Fruits (-1.65%), Dairy (-0.79%), Pulses & Legumes (-0.55%), Tobacco (-0.41%), and Prepared Food (-0.13%). Sugar & Sweeteners and Spices & Condiments remained unchanged (0.00%) during the week. The detailed list of commodities included under each category is provided at Annex-A.

CATEGORY-WISE DIVISION LEVEL ANALYSIS (WoW)

The division-wise analysis indicates mixed regional price movements across categories during the week. At the provincial (Sindh) level, the largest increase was recorded in Vegetables (+4.5%), followed by Meat & Protein (+1.1%), Clothing & Footwear (+1.1%), Household Supplies (+0.7%), Tea (+0.6%), Cereals & Bakery (+0.3%), Oils & Fats (+0.2%), and Fuel & Energy

(+0.1%). Sugar & Sweeteners and Spices & Condiments remained unchanged at 0.0%. The largest provincial decline was observed in Fruits (-1.6%), followed by Pulses & Legumes (-0.5%), Tobacco (-0.4%), Dairy (-0.3%), and Prepared Food (-0.1%).

Karachi recorded the largest increase in Vegetables (+7.8%), followed by Household Supplies (+2.1%), Spices & Condiments (+1.8%), Meat & Protein (+1.4%), Cereals & Bakery (+0.9%), Tea (+0.8%), Oils & Fats and Fuel & Energy (+0.5% each). Tobacco remained unchanged (0.0%). The largest decline was observed in Fruits (-3.5%), followed by Sugar & Sweeteners (-1.6%), Prepared Food (-0.5%), Clothing & Footwear (-0.4%), and Dairy and Pulses & Legumes (-0.3% each).

Hyderabad registered the largest increase in Vegetables (+4.5%), followed by Cereals & Bakery (+1.1%), Sugar & Sweeteners (+1.0%), Meat & Protein (+0.7%), Oils & Fats and Tobacco (+0.2% each). Tea, Prepared Food, and Clothing & Footwear remained unchanged (0.0%). The largest decline was observed in Pulses & Legumes (-0.8%), followed by Spices & Condiments (-0.4%), and Dairy, Fuel & Energy and Household Supplies (-0.2% each).

Sukkur recorded the largest increase in Fruits (+4.5%) and Vegetables (+4.5%), followed by Clothing & Footwear and Tea (+0.9% each), Oils & Fats (+0.7%), Fuel & Energy (+0.2%), and Dairy and Prepared Food (+0.1% each). Household Supplies remained unchanged (0.0%). The sharpest decline was recorded in Tobacco (-1.4%), followed by Cereals & Bakery (-1.0%), Spices & Condiments (-0.6%), Meat & Protein and Pulses & Legumes (-0.4% each), and Sugar & Sweeteners (-0.2%).

Larkana recorded the largest increase in Vegetables (+9.6%), followed by Fruits (+8.5%), Clothing & Footwear (+5.9%), Meat & Protein (+1.8%), Sugar & Sweeteners (+1.1%), Oils & Fats (+0.9%), Spices & Condiments (+0.8%), Pulses & Legumes (+0.5%), Cereals & Bakery and Tobacco (+0.4% each), and Fuel & Energy and Household Supplies (+0.3% each). Tea and Prepared Food remained unchanged (0.0%). The only decline was observed in Dairy (-0.9%).

Mirpurkhas recorded the largest increase in Meat & Protein (+1.7%), followed by Spices & Condiments (+0.9%), and Clothing & Footwear (+0.5%). Cereals & Bakery, Dairy, Oils & Fats, Sugar & Sweeteners, Tea, Prepared Food, Tobacco, Fuel & Energy, and Household Supplies

remained unchanged (0.0%). The sharpest declines were recorded in Fruits (-17.8%), Vegetables (-6.0%), and Pulses & Legumes (-1.4%).

Shaheed Benazirabad recorded the largest increase in Fruits (+3.8%), followed by Vegetables (+1.5%), Household Supplies (+0.6%), Dairy and Meat & Protein (+0.4% each), Oils & Fats (+0.3%), and Prepared Food (+0.1%). The largest decline was observed in Pulses & Legumes (-2.0%), followed by Spices & Condiments (-1.3%), Sugar & Sweeteners (-0.9%), Cereals & Bakery (-0.8%), Tobacco (-0.6%), Clothing & Footwear (-0.5%), Tea (-0.2%), and Fuel & Energy (-0.1%).

Overall, weekly price movements were characterized by significant, divergent swings in fresh produce categories—Vegetables and Fruits. Vegetables rose across five divisions, led by Larkana (+9.6%) and Karachi (+7.8%), while dropping sharply in Mirpurkhas (-6.0%). Conversely, Fruit prices saw steep declines in Mirpurkhas (-17.8%), Karachi (-3.5%), and Hyderabad (-1.8%), but posted sharp gains in Larkana (+8.5%), Sukkur (+4.5%), and Shaheed Benazirabad (+3.8%). Meat & Protein saw broad-based increases across five divisions, led by Larkana (+1.8%) and Mirpurkhas (+1.7%), with Sukkur being the sole exception (-0.4%).

Category-level values represent the **unweighted arithmetic average** of commodity-level changes within each respective category.

¹ Category changes in Table 1 are derived from the SPI-Sindh category indices using the prescribed item weights. The division-level figures in Table 3 represent averages of commodity-level percentage changes and are therefore not directly comparable with the category-index changes reported in Table 1.

For each division, the representative price of every commodity is calculated as the geometric mean of its district-level prices. Base prices and commodity weights are then applied to obtain weighted price relatives for the current and previous weeks. Commodity-level week-on-week percentage changes are calculated from the current- and previous-week weighted price relatives. The Sindh column is calculated independently using the geometric mean of prices across all 30 districts for each commodity, followed by the same weighting, week-on-week change and category-aggregation procedure. It is not calculated from the six divisional values.

CATEGORY-WISE MONTHLY PRICE MOVEMENT IN SPI-SINDH (03.09.2026 OVER 27.07.2026)

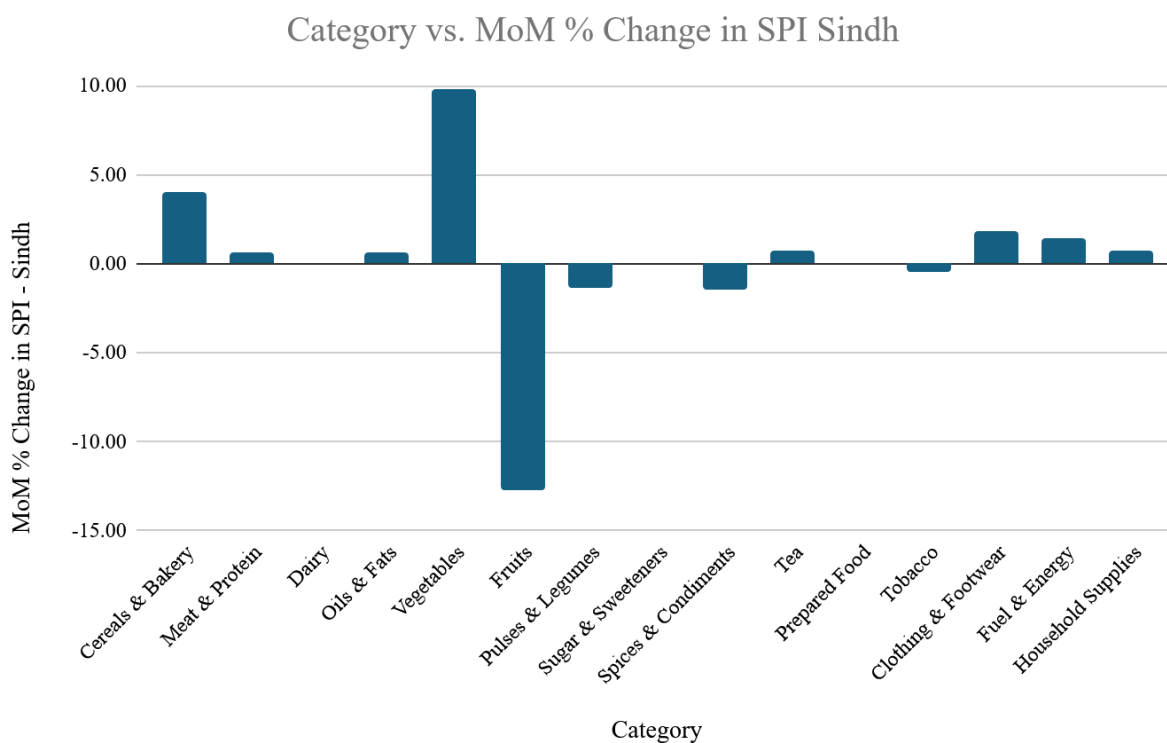
The category-wise MoM analysis for the period ending 03.09.2026 indicates an overall increase of 1.34 percent compared with 06.08.2026. The increase was led by Vegetables (9.79%), followed by Cereals & Bakery (4.01%), Clothing & Footwear (1.88%), Fuel & Energy (1.45%), Household Supplies (0.72%), Tea (0.70%), Meat & Protein (0.65%), Oils & Fats (0.61%), and Dairy (0.09%).

These increases were partly offset by decreases in Fruits (-12.68%), Spices & Condiments (-1.45%), Pulses & Legumes (-1.37%), and Tobacco (-0.41%).

Sugar & Sweeteners and Prepared Food remained unchanged (0.00%) during the period. The detailed list of commodities included under each category is provided at Annex-A.
